



The focus on evaluation



How do we structurally embed knowledge by experience in higher education?



- The 'how' can be about the following topics:
 - What kind of preparation was needed?
 - What were key elements to make it work?
 - What kind of challenges did you encounter?
 - When did knowledge by experience 'felt' fully embedded?
- = all those elements, stories and challenges, ... that are part of the process and result of SEKEHE.



Concrete expectations in general

- Keeping track of actions & meetings in different work packages
- Each country: build a practice that works for you & document
 - But the central question is the same for everyone
- The first year = exploratory on all conditions, stories, moments, lessons, challenges, ...
- Based on the international meeting (end of year 2023) we decide on which focus we take the following year

Concrete expectations co-teaching

- Use the 'moments' & 'reflections template to start & document the dialogues
- Use the Ugent document (evaluation and monitoring) to look at the content from team meetings, the photovoice & 'important' moments
 - = Framework for analysis
 - = Seek out blind spots


Concrete expectations photovoice

- Each country:
 - One or several groups?
 - Who are the team members?
 - Who guides the group?
- Example: Equality//ResearchCollective
 - Co-teaching Focus: Teachers, researcher & experts by experience
 - Student support: students, staff member, policy members, lecturers, researcher & experts by experience
 - Institutional change: staff members, coordinator, researcher
 - Tijs leads the groups
- Photovoice moments
 - Min. 3 moments
 - Choose your way of working
- International meeting= platform to create collective insights & analysis



What is photovoice?



What is photovoice?



- Photovoice is a method for participatory action research, in which people take pictures and discuss them as a way to establish personal and societal change. (Wang & Burris, 1994)
- "Photovoice is all about point-of-viewness: it sets out to capture and convey the point of view of the person holding the camera"
- Convey the point of view of people whose voices have been marginalized
- Promote critical dialogue and reflection on personal and community issues

What is photovoice?




- People themselves have a central role in research
- They take pictures about their lives and perspectives
- Pictures and experiences are shared within the group + critical reflection
- Process can result in personal change
- Starting point for recommendations and actions that can lead to societal change

How can we use photovoice?

- Diary work: Making photo's in your day to day activities and environments
- Create the moment: Share moments, discuss them and make photo's
- Exploring & specific
- Creating & discussing data




Experience the way of working

- 1. Starting points
- 2. Content building

Starting points



- The photographic experience
 - Just go out and make photo's
 - One topic or question
- Building conversation
 - Storytelling/weaving & using moments
- Crucial=
 - Individual expression (verbal and/or nonverbal)
 - Safe environment
 - Relation building

Relation building



- Excercise:
 - Go back to a moment that's relevant for SEKEHE
 - Who was there? What was happening? Where were you?
 - Do you remember what you were wearing, or certain sounds or smells?
 - How were you doing or feeling at that time in life?
 - [*If there is time you can choose to:
 - Ask people to think silently for 5 minutes
 - Let them write it down afterwords]

Share the moment

- In small groups
- You are the 'obstetrician' (or midwife)
 - Give birth to the moment
 - Ask questions to understand
 - Bring it to life
- [*If there is time you can choose to:
 - Share the stories in group one by one
 - There is (no) talking or reacting
 - No predefined structure of who goes first]

• Attention on:

- Safety & support individual expression
- Small connections to group connections
- Good environment / food/ drinks

Content building

• Excercise:

Discuss the moment


- What do you discover about these moments?
- [*You can choose to:
 - Keep it wide and general
 - Or add specific questions]

Connect to the group

- The moments are <u>not</u> retold
- The discoveries are shared with the group
- [*You can choose to:
 - Keep it wide and general
 - Or focus on specific questions]

- Create focus together

- If we hear al these discoveries, what what do you want to explore further?
- [*You can choose to:
 - Work as a group
 - Or go an individual journey]



Visual expressions



- Exercise:
 - Think back of the moments and discoveries
 - Which colour fits?
 - What texture fits?
 - Which places are central?
 - What kind of activities?
 - Go walking (as a group or individual)


Make photo's

- Focus on your ideas
- But also take pictures of what you like or suprises you
- Don't limit yourself

- But if you need focus or structure

- Choose on colour/texture to follow
- Pick one word as your guideline

Some 'visual' truths



- The only truth is your 'gut'
- Light is everything
- Take the time to look around
 - Look at lines
 - See the shade
 - Where are the details?
- Try different perspectives Up/down/close/far Shake the camera

 - To flash or not to flash
- Play with your surroundings
- There's no need for perfection

Group discussion & analysis




 Ideal condition: photo's are printed

Excercise: Choose one photo

- Step 1: describe what we see
 - Give factual elements
 - Name each element
- Step 2: interpret the photo together.
 - What does it mean?
 - How does it feel?
 - Why did you make it?
 - What does it represent?
 - How does the photo relate to our topic?
- Get everyone to share at least one photo




Reflections & critical ingredients



- It's more than the photo's
 - = building research practice
 - = building conversations
- Create the moment and take time
- Someone who prepares, leads and follows-up
- Material support (food, drinks, camera, nice space, ...)
- Record the conversations of make a report
- Have fun while doing it

Reflections & critical ingredients



- The verbal component remains important
- If the photos don't work for you, use another form of expression
- Who will take on the analysis of the conversations and photo discussions?
